Season of Giving

The "season of giving" wouldn't be complete without an update on St. Luke's end of year giving. Thanks to careful budgeting and bonus funding from our "burn the mortgage" event series, the Social Justice Collaboration Team had the pleasure of designating over \$56,000 in year -end financial gifts to a thoughtful variety of partners and causes. These gifts come in addition to both our monthly change-for-change donations and funding disbursements that occur throughout the year as we work along side our partners for justice, peace and a fair future for all.

(Note: we aim to include more communication about these on-going, monthly funding grants in the *Challenge* - be on the lookout for a new feature section!)

A majority of these year-end funds were used to make major gifts to our partners of deepest engagement. Gifts ranging from \$8,000 to \$11,000 were given to:



January Dementia Awareness Information

Tips for having a conversation with a person with dementia:

Come from the front, identify yourself and keep good eye contact.

Ideally, converse in a quiet space with minimal distractions.

Use short, simple phrases and repeat information as needed.

Ask one question at a time. Yes or no questions are good.

Speak slowly and clearly. Use a gentle and relaxed tone.

Patiently wait for a response while the person takes time to process what you said. (may be up to 20 seconds)

Women Connecting


Share your hopes for the New Year at the January Women Connecting


